I-75 Improvement Project More Than a New Road

There has been some exciting stuff going on behind the scenes regarding the I-75 Improvement Project and the rebuilding of the new Hopple Street Bridge.

The Metropolitan Sewer District, Cincinnati Water Works, Hamilton County Commissioners and Cincinnati City Council, Cincinnati's Department of Transportation and Engineering, and, community council, business association, residents and business owners have all had input on the design of the improvement. This includes water control and storm sewer diversion and separation techniques. Rain gardens, bio swales, are also being panned into the improvement.

Whether you know it or not, there are many very large storm sewer pipes running from high up in the Clifton hills, through the basin of Camp Washington, continuing under the former Kahn's site, and the railroads to the West, ultimately ending up into the Millcreek. The way water runs down the hills is incorporating creative green, planning ideas.

One exciting result of the I-75 project (which may be back on track to start in 2013) is the generation of new sewer credits in the area. These credits offer capacity for new industrial and business development.
