

We are a long-time removed from the days of simply needing a high school diploma to get a good job. However, getting your GED is the first step in the path of a job or career.

New City Council Starts Strong

The November 2011 election results are over, resulting in a substantially new Council. Camp Washington voted like many others, choosing four new candidates, including three first-time candidates who are also YPs (young professionals).

This is exciting for us, as the last several years have been bruising budget battles ensaring the recreation center and pool, Neighborhood Support Programs and CNBDU funds, vacant lot litter program, among other important City servi es affecting Camp.

City Manager Milton Dohoney said that the City budget will be passed December 14, with no layoffs and no pool/rec center closings. We are excited that funding levels for NSP and CNBDU have been raised to \$5,000 each. This helps fund our newsletter, streescapes, garden and clean up projects, etc.

We welcome the new council members and look forward to working with them to make our neighborhood cleaner, safer, and more liveable.
