Bates Bridge Coming Down

The I-75 Improvement Project is truly underway. With remarkable speed, the Bates Avenue bridge across I-75 going to Central Parkway is quickly being taken down. Contracters are working through the night on the bridge. Tree crews using a massive crane and daring-do tree specialists have taken out several big trees at the end of Massachusetts by Bates. The pedestrian bridge at the end of Colerain Avenue has also been removed. Over the next few years, we will see a major change in the Millcreek Valley, including a massive Metropolitan Sewer District (MSD) project in Fairmount.

The Hopple Street Bridge project will begin after Mitchell Avenue Interchange project is completed within three years.
